#### FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS

- Global equities advanced in September. US President Trump's proposal to reduce corporate taxes and eliminate estate tax lifted sentiment. Separately, the Federal Reserve's plan to end quantitative easing boosted the US dollar and financials sector.
- In the Eurozone, economic growth momentum was supported by domestic consumption, capital investment and international trade. But rising populist discontent in Germany, Catalonia's referendum on secession from Spain, and the ongoing Brexit negotiations, caused jitters in the equity markets.
- Elsewhere, China reduced the reserve-requirement ratio for selected banks that provide credit to small businesses, ahead of its national congress in October. Tensions between the US and North Korea resulted in fresh sanctions against Pyongyang.
- Oil prices rose marginally, after the International Energy Agency said the global supply glut was starting to shrink, and amid signs of firmer demand.
- There were no major portfolio changes in September.
