FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Developed markets rally was stopped by the concerns over the new Omicron variant and the more hawkish comment from Fed Chairman Powell. S&P 500, MSCI Europe and MSCI Japan declined by 0.7%, 2.5% and 2.9% respectively in local currency terms. US equity market fared better as investors flew to safety. The US Dollar appreciated by 2% MTD with Japanese Yen flat and Euro depreciated by 2%. US 10-year bond yield has risen over the month but recently came down to 1.5% at the time of writing.

Manufacturing PMIs have held up well across all developed markets, all in expansion zone. With increasing vaccinations and easing COVID restrictions, Japan's economy continues to recover with PMI edged higher in November. Business confidence and employment is also improving. The 12m forward corporate earnings were revised higher for US and Japan with Europe staying flat.

We are monitoring closely the vaccine effectiveness and severity of the new Omicron variant. Whether global economy will continue its recovery trend from the pandemic depends on whether existing vaccines can prevent severe cases and hospitalizations against Omicron. Even if current vaccines do not work effectively, vaccine providers have indicated their ability to quickly produce new vaccines. However, more details need to be confirmed in coming weeks. Whether Omicron could derail a robust economic recovery could also affect Fed's monetary decision. Equity markets may see short-term volatility if Fed decides to taper at a faster pace and bring forward the interest hike. Before we get more clarify on Omicron, our base case is to continue expect above trend growth across all developed markets moving to 2022. We are seeing resilient retail and employment data from US. If the supply chain bottlenecks continue to ease, Japan manufacturing sectors will continue to recover. We are overweight US and Japan on resilient earnings outlook. We are neutral on Europe, where a rising fourth wave has forced countries to implement different movement restrictions that will adversely impactconsumer sentiment. On an overall basis, we main overweight in developed equity markets.
