## PERFORMANCE RECORD

## FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The Target Fund's return is at -1.95% in the month of November, outperforming MSCI ACWI by +0.46%. However, this was meaningfully impacted by the timing for the cut-off of the fund valuation and on an end of day basis, the strategy underperformed by ca. 100bps. Underperformance was driven by stock selection within Technology as 'Payment' holdings were once again hit by both growing concerns over COVID and the impact of the Omicron variant, and the prospect for disruption.

Impact Focus of the Month: A position has been initiated in Bank Rakyat an Indonesian bank with a focus on micro loans via its large network of agents that allows branchless contact across the large Indonesian archipelago. This community led network affords the company a significant advantage in gaining deposits, providing loans and also to perform an informal risk screen. The company allows the historically under banked population access to financial services - a large proportion of which are "productive" loans i.e. used to support entrepreneurs, and provides an alternative to the informal lending sector. The impact metrics we track are the volume of micro loans outstanding (IDR trillion) and the number of micro loan borrowers (mm).

The greatest contributors to performance were AO Smith (+8%) and Johnson Controls (+2%). The greatest detractors were PayPal (-21%) and Safaricom (-12%), and not holding Nvidia which advanced another 28% over the month. PayPal initiated disappointing 2022 guidance revenue growth of high teens that was substantially below consensus, which has added to concerns around the prospect for core growth and reinforces the perception that pursuing Pinterest was driven by management concerns that growth is stalling. We believe the underperformance of Safaricom to have been predominantly technically driven and have taken the opportunity to add to our position.
