PERFORMANCE RECORD

This fund feeds into Principal Islamic Aggressive Wholesale Fund-of-Funds (“target fund”) with the objective to achieve capital growth by investing in a portfolio of Shariah-compliant collective investment schemes that invest primarily in Shariah-compliant equities.

FUND MANAGER’S COMMENTS

In July, the Fund rose by 9.54%, underperforming the Benchmark by 2.01%. China, Korea and India contributed positively to the outperformance while Singapore and Taiwan were detractors. Year-to-date, the Fund rose by 7.21%, underperforming the Benchmark by 3.50%.

Asian markets rallied in July led by Taiwan, China, India while Singapore, Philippines and Australia were laggards. Gold price soared +11% benefiting from the abundance of liquidity and depressed bond yields. The global reflation trade is likely to sustain driven by the revival of economic activities as countries re-open for business, ample financial liquidity by central banks and absence of inflationary pressures due to weak labour market. China, US and Eurozone’s PMI are all showing encouraging signs and point to a strong backdrop for equity earnings recovery in 2H20 and into 2021. The negative real rate environment throughout developed markets provides a cushion for Asian currencies.

For regional equities, we continue to be highly invested and positioned for growth. For new ideas, we have preference for stocks with differentiated businesses from the rest of the portfolio. As for Malaysia, We are turning cautious on small- and mid-cap stocks following recent rally and advise taking profit. On the big cap space, the benchmark index will continue to be driven almost entirely by the glove sector. Although we believe there is still leg in the glove rally, risk-reward is more balanced now after YTD rally and therefore advise to reduce portfolio position by 1-1.5%. The Malaysian equity market could also be susceptible to broader base correction particularly on concern of political uncertainty (domestic and US), but we believe any broad base correction will unlikely to re-test Mar’s low given the supportive monetary and fiscal stimulus. We reiterate our AA position at 90-95%. Focus sectors will be on Plantation, Financials/Bursa and Oil & Gas.

Country risk

The Fund may invest into Islamic CIS which can be domiciled in various countries. Therefore, the Fund will be subjected to risks specific to the countries in which the Islamic CIS are domiciled in. Such risks include adverse changes in economic fundamentals, social and political stability, laws and regulations and foreign investments policies. These factors may be an adverse impact on the prices of the Islamic CIS, which will depress the Islamic CIS's NAV growth, and consequently depress the Fund's NAV growth.

Currency risk

As the Fund may invest into Islamic CIS denominated in currencies other than MYR, any fluctuation in the exchange rate between MYR and the currencies in which the Islamic CIS are denominated may have an impact on the value of these investments. You should be aware that if the currencies in which the Islamic CIS are denominated depreciate against MYR, this will have an adverse effect on the NAV of the Fund in MYR and vice versa. You should note that any gains or losses arising from the fluctuation in the exchange rate may further increase or decrease the returns of the investment.
